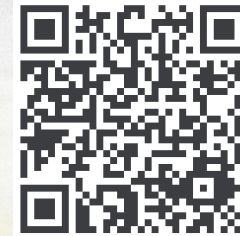

What happened in the Spanish enclave of Melilla on June 24th 2022 and what does it mean?
